Stalls

Stall assignments may be picked up at the stall manager's trailer located north of Gate 6 at 5:00 PM on arrival date. Any request for early stall assignment must be made with entries, with appropriate fees paid.

Exhibitors are requested to check this schedule carefully. Horses must arrive and depart according to this schedule unless previous arrangements have been made at the time entries are accepted. There are no exceptions.

Exhibitors keeping horses over from one show to another must pay the regular stall fee for each horse for each day and/or night the stall is occupied. Stalls will be assigned according to number of horses and date

entry receipted.

Stallions and unruly horses will be placed in protective stalls. No refunds on stall fees for any reason.

Entry to Grounds

Horse show exhibitors to enter through Gate 6 located on San Pedro, just south of Lomas. **During Fairtime, no left turn is allowed from southbound San Pedro.**

Parking

Special parking facilities will be provided for horse trailers. Immediately after unloading, all trailers must be moved to the off-site parking lot (location to be announced).

Departures

All exhibitors must obtain a release from the stall office in order to leave the grounds.

Horses will be released at the conclusion of their show and must vacate stalls one hour after their show is over unless other arrangements have been made.

Premium Requirements

No more than two premiums will be awarded to a single exhibitor in any one class.

A first place winner of a class is not considered a champion until it has advanced and won in higher competition.

Three horses must be shown and judged for payback in halter (including Championships) and performance classes (including Stakes and Championships).

Awards

Premiums will be paid on basis of number of horses shown in each class. Hunter/Jumper scale listed in H/J rules section.

Individuals will receive placing ribbons. Payback (except for H/J) will be as described below.

Entries

Entering in Multiple Divisions

Our computer system requires **a separate entry blank with separate check for each division in which a horse is entered.** For example, a horse cross-entering between Pinto and Paint will need two blanks and two checks. Thank you for your cooperation.

Deadline

Post Entries

Post entries (those made after the Late Entry deadlines) will be accepted with double the entry fee until 5:00 PM the evening before the show day. This applies only to horses already entered in classes.

Post entries will be accepted in Championship and Stake classes without penalty.

Entries made on the day of the show will be double the entry fee, plus a \$5.00 transaction fee per class and must be made at least 3 classes in advance.

Additional Required Documents

A photocopy of registration papers for each horse must accompany entry where required.

Photocopies of membership cards for owners, trainers and all rider/handlers must accompany entries for those breeds that have specific membership requirements.

Amateur Cards are required for all Amateur classes in all breeds. Membership numbers and Youth numbers where applicable must accompany entry.

Absolutely no premium will be paid unless the appropriate Social Security Number is shown on the entry blank.

Incomplete Entries

Money for incomplete entries received by the Entry Department will be receipted, but classes will not be entered in the computer until complete information is received.

If required information is not received by closing date, exhibitor will be assessed a late penalty fee. Any entry received without payment will be returned.

Acknowledgements

Acknowledgment of entries will be mailed or e-mailed to all exhibitors.

GENERAL RULES

The shows are held under the rules of various breed associations, and their rules, including those regarding registration, will govern. Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of show rules. New Mexico State Fair rules apply in classes not covered by individual breed rules.

New Mexico Livestock Rules Summary

The following is a summary of the New Mexico Livestock Rules and Regulations for horses entering the show grounds.

The New Mexico Livestock Board governs the movement of livestock into shows, fairs, and exhibitions.

This summary is current at the time of preparation of this premium list. The official regulations will supersede this summary if there is a conflict between the two. For further clarification or information contact the New Mexico Livestock Board at (505) 841-6161.

Health Requirements

All horses entering the grounds are subject to veterinary inspection.

New Mexico horses must have:

- (1) A health certificate dated within 30 days prior to their show. A current Coggins is now REQUIRED by the State Veterinarian's Office for in-state horses participating in exhibitions.
- (2) A Certificate of Livestock Inspection or a NM permanent traveling card.

Horses originating out of state must have:

- (1) A health certificate dated within 30 days prior to their show.
- (2) A negative Coggins test dated within 12 months for horses over 6 months of age (lab and test date required on certificate.)

The stall manager must receive your health certificates before your stall assignment can be issued.

All stallions' health certificates must indicate that:

- (1) the stallion has tested negative for EVA
- (2) the stallion has tested negative for EVA OR was initially vaccinated within 10 days of the date of the test (corrected 8/31/11)
- (3) the horse is being transported for exhibition only and, if originating from out of state, must show the date that they will be leaving New Mexico.

It is highly recommended that all horses be vaccinated for:

- (1) West Nile virus, including a booster
- (2) Rhinopneumonitis within the last 3 months
- (3) Strangles

Please check this section again before hauling to the Fair to make sure health paper requirements have not changed. You will also need to check the NM Livestock Board website at www.nmlbonline for any changes.

Arrival

Please check the Arrival and Departure Schedule carefully as horses will be admitted to the grounds and released only on the scheduled dates. Please do not plan to arrive before 5:00 PM without calling ahead for permission, as your stalls may not be ready for you prior to that time. We reserve the right to change this schedule.

Arenas

Horse Arena is 117' x 250'; Roping Arena is 125' x 264'. Footing in all arenas and warm-up areas is sandy loam.

Back Numbers

Exhibitors not wearing the correct show number assigned to the horse may be disqualified.

Cancellation

(1) Of Classes:

Show management reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes without at least three entries, as allowed by breed rules.

(2) Of Show:

The New Mexico State Fair reserves the absolute right to cancel any breed that is not of show quality and/or without a proportionate representation of exhibitors from showing at the State Fair. In addition, any breed or discipline whose number of horses entered drops below twenty-five animals in any given year will be required to pay for their judge and judge's expenses for the following year(s) until their numbers increase to at least twenty five.

Changes to this Premium Book

The New Mexico State Fair will not be liable for any misprints of rules, classes or schedules. We reserve the right to adjust the schedule or to substitute judges if necessary. Any changes or corrections will be posted in the respective Horse Show sections of this premium book at our web site at www.exponm.com. **Please double-check the Health Requirements section before coming to our show in case of any late changes to our rules.**

Dogs

Absolutely no dogs will be allowed on the fairgrounds, other than those on a leash for competition or Qualified Assistance Animals (Section 28-11-3 N.M.S.A.)

Entries:

Entry Fees & Payments

- (1) Stall, entry fees and other charges are listed in this premium book. Late entry fees will be charged as noted.
- (2) Overpayments in the amount of \$10.00 or less will not be refunded
- (3) If payment is stopped on a check after entry deadline, exhibitor will be turned in to his or her respective breed association, and may be banned from future State Fair Horse Shows.
- (4) If check for entry fee is returned by the bank for non-sufficient funds, exhibitor will be charged an NSF fee of \$35.00

Please Note! Our computer system requires a separate entry blank with separate check for each division in which a horse is entered. For example, a horse cross-entering between Pinto and Paint will need two blanks and two checks. Thank you for your cooperation.

Entry Rules

- (1) Entries must be made in the name of the owner (who is the exhibitor) or a bona fide lessee.
- (2) Social Security Number and full mailing address of owner must be on the entry

form in order to receive prize money.

- (3) Entries must be printed or written in legible handwriting. Name and address of riders as well as owner, and trainer must be listed on entry blank.
- (4) All youth and junior exhibitors showing in Youth and Open Classes **must have the minor's release on the entry blank signed by a parent or guardian at the time of entry.** Birthdate of all youth and junior exhibitors must be provided on the entry form in order to enter youth and junior exhibitor classes.

Post Entries

NMSF reserves the right to accept entries after the entry deadline in order to maintain breed ratings or for the overall good of the show.

Golf Carts and Other Motorized Vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainers who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may included exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardians(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

High Point Awards

All high point awards (buckles, gift certificates and cash) offered by NMSF will be awarded on the point system adopted by each show's respective breed association or governing association.

Liability

- (1) NMSF liability statement on entry blank must be signed by an adult.
- (2) The Exhibitor shall defend, hold harmless, and indemnify the NMSF and the State of New Mexico and its employees from any and all claims, damages, expenses, cost, fees, (including attorney's fees) and liabilities of any type or description whatsoever arising from the performance of the exhibitor and/or his employees/members under this Agreement.
- (3) The Exhibitor shall not be responsible to defend, hold harmless, and indemnify the NMSF and the State of New Mexico for any liability to the extent such liability is directly caused by wrongful acts, errors, or omissions of the NMSF, the State of New Mexico, or their officers, agents, employees or servants.

Number of Entries per Class

- (1) Classes with less than 3 entries will be canceled or combined at management's discretion (breed rules apply).
- (2) In performance classes, an exhibitor may enter one or more horses except where prohibited by breed rules. Where exhibitors may enter multiple horses, payback will be made only to the top two placing animals owned by a single

exhibitor.

Paddock Gate

A two minute clock will start when first horse enters the arena. Gate will be closed at the end of two minutes. In classes where exhibitors compete individually, there shall be a 3 minute gate for the first competitor and no delay thereafter. In timed events, rider must start and finish from a closed gate for safety reasons.

Parking Permits / Exhibitor Passes

- (1) Each exhibitor is required to purchase a \$4 parking pass for each day of his/her show. This pass will admit one vehicle and the driver. Because of the limited parking area available at Gate 6, any additional parking passes will be \$10.00 per day and do not include the driver's admission. Your move-in day is free. Overflow parking will go to Gate 8.
- (2) All exhibitors (except those showing on "dark days", Sept. 12 and 13, must have an exhibitor's pass. Passes are \$4.00/day .Your move-in day is free.
- (3) Parking permit stickers must be securely attached to windshield of vehicle. Parking passes are required beginning Sept. 9th.

Protests

- (1) Any protest must be made in writing to Show Management within one hour of the class involved (48 hours in USEF Divisions), accompanied by an affidavit setting forth grounds for the protest, and by a deposit of \$200 cash or certified check (\$300 for USEF non-members), which sum will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.
- (2) If the protest is sustained and placings are affected, the entries standing next in award will be moved up accordingly. New Mexico State Fair Management's decisions on protests will be final.
- (3) For USEF Divisions see USEF Protest Rule.

Refunds

(1) NMSF will consider refunds for injuries to the animal, or for injury to the handler, rider or driver only if a complete veterinary statement signed by a licensed veterinarian or medical excuse signed by a doctor is received by the conclusion of the show(s) entered. Office fees and passes will not be refunded. In the event of a horse's death, refund of entries will be at the discretion of Fair Management.

- (2) NMSF will not refund fees in the event of cancellation of classes due to severe weather or other emergency.

Refusal & Disqualification of Entries

New Mexico State Fair reserves the absolute right:

- (1) to reject any entry for any reason prior to show time without liability except for the refund of entry and breed fees.
- (2) to have any exhibitor and his animals removed from the grounds without liability at any time during the Fair for cause (including but not limited to: intoxication,

threatening behavior or unsportsmanlike conduct.) Acceptance of this rule is a condition of entry.

- (3) Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, groom, exhibitor or trainer of any horse at the show , or by the parent of any youth exhibitor will disqualify such horse or participant from adjudication, and the owner shall forfeit his entry and other fees.
- (4) Any exhibitor, parent, trainer, rider, driver, handler or groom who shall attempt to interfere with judges in the performance of their duties, or who shall make any false statement in regard to any animal exhibited or shall interfere with clerks' and judges' books, shall be excluded from the competition and may be subject to other disciplinary actions.

Riders

- (1) Breed rules apply on the number of times a rider may ride within a class. Each horse may have only one rider per class.
- (2) A rider in individual working events may show both junior and senior horses in all age classes or a class that has been combined.
- (3) All changes of riders must be made in the office 30 minutes prior to class being called. All required membership cards for the rider must be provided at time of change.

Sharps Containers

Exhibitors must properly dispose of needles in the sharps containers placed throughout the barns. The Fair may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 per incident for improper disposal of needles or other sharp instruments.

Stalls

All horses must have a stall. (Because of limited parking, we are unable to accommodate day trippers.) Exhibitors keeping horses over from one show to another must pay the regular stall fee for each horse for each day the stall is used. No refunds on stall fees for any reason.

NMSF Stalls are permanent (10'x10'x7') stalls with doors and dirt floors. First bedding is not provided. Shavings and feed will be available on the grounds from the 4-W Feedstore. Stalls must be kept neat and supplied with clean bedding. Walkways must be kept clean and open for the convenience of spectators and clean up crews. Horses that bite, kick or are unruly must be tied.

Stallions

NO Stallions may be entered in performance classes where prohibited by breed or division rules.

Show Ring

- (1) The show ring will be under the absolute control of the Management or a representative of the Management. Only qualified persons will be allowed in the ring during judging.
- (2) When in the ring, each animal must be in halter or bridle and under control of rider, driver, handler or groom.

- (3) Should there be an unnecessary or embarrassing delay in bringing animals into the show ring, the superintendent may exclude such animals from competition.

Substitution

A veterinarian's certificate will be accepted as proof of sickness, injury, or death of a horse. Provided such proof is furnished before show, substitution of horse will be permitted with the same owner in a comparable class (This does not apply to 4-H Horses.)

Vet-Outs/Medical Excuses

Upon presentation of a detailed letter from a veterinarian or medical doctor:

Any horse scratched prior to the first closing date of entries will be refunded all fees, less office fees.

Any horse scratched after the closing date and before the seal is broken on its stall will be refunded all fees less a \$25 vet-out fee, and less the cost of vehicle passes/exhibitor passes (unless returned unused to the show office.)

Any horse scratched during the horse show will be refunded only unused class fees. No vet or medical certificates will be accepted after the show in which the horse and person are entered.
