Arrival / Departure

Begins at noon on September 16th, 2011 but must be on grounds by September 17th, 2011 at 12:00 pm. Release at conclusion of show. Goats must be off grounds by 8:00 am on September 21st, 2011

Trailer Parking

Special parking facilities will be provided for livestock trailers. Immediately after unloading, all trailers must be moved. Location to be announced.

Governing Rules

All rules governing livestock in the General Rules and Regulations apply to this department.

Show Sanction Details

The Junior and Senior shows are separately sanctioned in the Open Division.

The Junior and Senior shows are not separately sanctioned in the Youth (Junior) Division.

This show is officially sanctioned by The American Dairy Goat Association. ADGA rules Shall Govern

Fees

1. \$12.00 will be charged for each head entered in Open show.
2. Late fees for Dairy Goats will be \$5.00 per animal, per class.
3. Group class entry is \$12.00
4. Milking Competition: \$10.00 will be charged for each head entered in the Milking Competition.
5. Parking Fee: Gate 6 is \$20.00 for duration of show which includes one admission pass. Gate 8 is \$15.00 for duration of show.
6. Exhibitor Fee: \$15.00 for adults for duration of show and \$10.00 for youth for duration of show.
7. Parking fee, Office fee, Exhibitor Pass fees, and late entry fees (if applicable) must accompany entry.

Entry Regulations:

1. All animals must be entered in the name of the owner or the one leasing the animal.
2. Ownership must be dated at least 90 days prior to the opening day of the fair.

3. Only does are eligible.
4. No entry will be accepted without registered tattoo recorded on entry card.
5. The animal's tattoo must be legible or the entry will be disqualified and no premium will be awarded.
6. All goats, regardless of age, must be registered with the American Dairy Goat Association, the American Goat Society or the Canadian Goat Society.
7. Stamped and duplicate applications will be accepted on animals under 6 months of age.
8. NO signed transfers will be accepted as per ADGA rules.
9. Tack Pens: one pen per exhibitor upon availability. Check with Superintendent at time of check-in.

Attire

1. Exhibitors are required to see that their showmen and attendants are neatly and appropriately attired.
2. Exhibitors may wear white shirts and denim jeans or dairy colors while exhibiting.

Federal Sheep and Goat ID Requirements for Scrapie

Sheep and goats that are sexually intact and used for breeding, show and/or exhibition are required to have official individual animal and premises identification prior to sale or movement. For further information, contact Mike Greenly, USDA, Albuquerque Office, (505) 761-3160.

Milking Competition Rules

1. This will be an ADGA Sanctioned One Day Test.
2. Entrants must be checked-in by noon on Saturday, September 17th, 2011.
3. Animals entered only in Milking Competition may be dismissed Sunday evening following the Competition.
4. Freshening date is required on entry form
5. Late entry must be postmarked no later than August 12, 2011. No exceptions.
6. Substitutions will be allowed for same class, same show entries.
7. Substitutions will be accepted until 12:00 noon on Saturday.

Group Classes

Each animal in a group must be shown as an individual in the appropriate class

1. Junior Get Of Sire:
 - a. Shall consist of three does under two years of age that have not freshened, the get of one sire.
 - b. Sire must be named on entry form.
 - c. Each exhibitor limited to one group entry per named sire.
 - d. All does need not be owned by exhibitor.
2. Senior Get Of Sire:
 - a. Shall consist of three does, at least 1 in milk, Get of Sire.
 - b. Sire must be named on entry form.
 - c. Each exhibitor limited to one group entry per named sire.
 - d. All does need not be owned by exhibitor.
3. Senior Dairy Herd:
 - a. To consist of four does in milk.
 - b. All animals must be owned by exhibitor.
 - c. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per breed.
4. Breeders Trio:
 - a. To consist of three does.
 - b. All bred by exhibitor.
 - c. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per breed.
 - d. All animals need not be owned by exhibitor.
5. Dam And Daughter:
 - a. To consist of Milking Dam and one daughter.
 - b. Dam must be named on entry form.
 - c. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per dam.
 - d. Both animals need not be owned by exhibitor.
6. Produce Of Dam
 - a. To consist of two animals from the same dam.
 - b. Dam must be named on entry form.
 - c. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per dam.
 - d. All animals need not be owned by exhibitor.

Awards

Championship Awards

1. Junior Grand Champion: In each breed is chosen from the first place dairy goats from classes 1 through 5.
2. Junior Reserve Grand Champion: In each breed is chosen from animals eligible for Junior Grand Champion and the second place animal from the class producing the Junior Grand Champion.

3. Best Junior Doe In Show: Is chosen from the Junior Grand Champions of all competing breeds.
4. Senior Grand Champion: In each breed is chosen from the first place dairy goats from classes 10 through 13.
5. Senior Reserve Grand Champion: In each breed is chosen from the eligible animals for Senior Grand Champion and the second place animal from the class producing the Senior Grand Champion.
6. Best Doe Of Breed: Is selected from the Senior Grand Champion and the winner of the Champion Challenge Class of that breed.
7. Best Senior Doe In Show: Is selected from the Best Doe of Breed of all breeds present.

Exhibitor Awards

1. Premier Exhibitor:
 - a. This award is made to the exhibitor of the eight or fewer animals winning the most money in open single classes.
 - b. Open Junior Doe and Open Senior Doe shows are included.
 - c. No limit on number of animals exhibited, but the award is automatically figured on a maximum of eight animals.
 - d. Separate awards for each breed.
2. Premier Breeder:
 - a. This award is made to the breeder of the eight or fewer animals winning the most money in open single competition, bred by him but may be exhibited by others.
 - b. Open Junior Doe and Open Senior Doe Shows are included.
 - c. No limit on number of animals exhibited, but the award is automatically figured on a maximum of eight animals.
 - d. Separate award for each breed.

To show their appreciation to herdsman for their cooperation in making the best possible presentation of their exhibits to the public and for their help in keeping our show buildings attractive, the New Mexico State Fair offers Herdsman Awards as follows:

Goat ID Rules

LaMancha Goat Identification Requirements

The USDA requires all breeding stock (sheep and goats) leaving their premises of origin transfer of ownership must have a breed registry tattoo or a scrapie tag (9 CFR 79.2 and 9 CFR79.3). With respect to 21 NMAC 32.2.8.3, 21 NMAC 32.4.12 and 21 NMAC 32.4.17, all sheep and goats must be permanently identified which at least one NMLB approved form of official identification. To alleviate the concern for the LaMancha goats, an alternative method for identification is as follows:

1) Registered LaMancha goats must have a legible permanent breed registry tattoo placed in the tail web or flank. A breed registry number may be used in lieu of a scrapie tag if the owner has a NM sheep/goat master brand number. The owner may wish to utilize a scrapie tag in addition to a breed registry tattoo, in which case the scrapie tag must be affixed to a neck chain.

2) Unregistered LaMancha goats must have the owner's NM sheep and goat master brand number tattooed in the either the tail web or flank. In the case of 4-H/FFA animals, the 4-H/FFA member may use the 4-H or FFA master brand number. The tattoo must be permanent and legible. The scrapie tag must be affixed to a neck chain.

Identification Requirements for all other goat breeds

1) Registered goats must have a legible permanent breed registry tattoo placed in the ear, tail web or flank. A breed registry number may be used in lieu of a scrapie tag if the owner has a NM sheep/goat master brand number.

2) Unregistered goats must have the owner's NM sheep and goat master brand number tattooed in the either the ear, tail web or flank. The tattoo must be permanent and legible. The scrapie tag must be applied to the ear.

In the case of 4-H/FFA animals, the 4-H/FFA member may use the 4-H or FFA master brand number. The tattoo must be permanent and legible. The scrapie tag must be applied to the ear.

SHEEP AND GOATS

- Proof of ownership (NMLB "form 1" inspection certificate) must accompany the animal when traveling, whether in or out of district; this is the assurance that all requirements are met.
- A NMLB APPROVED fair ear tag provided by the NMLB, a N.M. registered tattoo and a Form 1 inspection issued by the NMLB.
- Sexually intact sheep and goats must have an official USDA Scrapie tag applied to the ear and/or breed registration tattoo.
- This rule applies to all species and breeds entered in junior shows.

ADDITIONAL RULES

- 1) No copies or faxed copies of TB test charts (VS Form 6-22) or health certificates will be accepted, unless signed by the veterinarian (who administered the test) in blue ink certifying the copy. The exhibitor must bring these documents to fair check-in.
- 2) NMLB approved regulatory identification is required for all test eligible animals.

- 3) Any clinical signs or evidence of an infectious and/or contagious disease will result in that animals immediate removal from the fair grounds.
- 4) Out of state equine and livestock entries must adhere to New Mexico entry requirements and all current New Mexico fair entry requirements. Please call the NMLB office for state entry requirements.

ANY ANIMAL, ARRIVING AT A SHOW OR FAIR, FOUND NOT TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH NEW MEXICO STATE STATUTES OR LIVESTOCK BOARD RULES WILL BE SENT HOME AND GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO BECOME COMPLIANT FOR FUTURE SHOWS AND FAIRS.

This information is provided only as a guide and may not contain all necessary requirements for livestock bound for exhibits and shows. It is extremely important to consult your 4-H Leader, FFA Advisor, County Agent and your Livestock Inspector for updated information well ahead of your planned date of transport. Be sure to contact the destination fairs and livestock shows for their own rules.
