**GUIDE FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS  
2011 SEASON**

All in-state junior livestock (cattle, sheep, goats and swine) showing at New Mexico fairs must have an NMLB APPROVED fair tag furnished by the NMLB and a Form 1 inspection issued by the NMLB before entering any county or state fair. All out of state livestock must comply with New Mexico import requirements. The Form 1 inspection will be issued at the time the NMLB APPROVED tag is placed in the animal, tags will be issued by the NMLB. The application of the tag will be completed by the extension agent, FFA advisor or fair personnel. All animals must be inspected no later than July 15th. The purpose of these requirements is to keep on file a record of animals that are commingled at fairs and shows.

**SWINE**

- Proof of ownership must accompany the animal (NMLB "Form 1" inspection certificate).
- Inspection must be completed prior to July 15th of current year.
- All health and ID requirements must be met.
- All swine from out-of-state must receive an import inspection at destination and must be accompanied by the original or a copy stamped and verified "official" by an NMLB inspector, certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) and import permit.

**ADDITIONAL RULES**

- 1) No copies or faxed copies of TB test charts (VS Form 6-22) or health certificates will be accepted, unless signed by the veterinarian (who administered the test) in blue ink certifying the copy. The exhibitor must bring these documents to fair check-in.
- 2) NMLB approved regulatory identification is required for all test eligible animals.
- 3) Any clinical signs or evidence of an infectious and/or contagious disease will result in that animals immediate removal from the fair grounds.
- 4) Out of state equine and livestock entries must adhere to New Mexico entry requirements and all current New Mexico fair entry requirements. Please call the NMLB office for state entry requirements.

**ANY ANIMAL, ARRIVING AT A SHOW OR FAIR, FOUND NOT TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH NEW MEXICO STATE STATUTES OR LIVESTOCK BOARD RULES WILL BE SENT HOME AND GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO BECOME COMPLIANT FOR FUTURE SHOWS AND FAIRS.**

This information is provided only as a guide and may not contain all necessary requirements for livestock bound for exhibits and shows. It is extremely important to consult your 4-H Leader, FFA Advisor, County Agent and your Livestock Inspector for updated information well ahead of your planned date of transport. Be sure to contact the destination fairs and livestock shows for their own rules. Good luck and congratulations on having fit your animals for the show!

# Division Rules

1. **See Jr. Division General Livestock Rules.**
2. **Ownership:** All barrows to be farrowed on or after January 1, 2011. Gilts cannot be shown in market classes. Any animals shown in this department must have been continuously owned and personally cared for by the exhibitor since June 11, 2011 and cannot be transferred from 4-H or FFA or vice versa, or within family during the feeding period. All bill of sales must be dated on or prior to June 11, 2011. Market Barrows must be tagged with NMSF ear tag and Hair DNA sample postmarked to NM Veterinary Diagnostic Services by June 11, 2011 to be eligible for entry. Hair DNA sample must be postmarked no later than June 11, 2011.
3. **Entries:** The entry deadline is midnight July 11, 2011. Entries will only be accepted on-line through the New Mexico State Fair web-site. The entry fee is \$15.00 per barrow. The entry fee for the Showmanship Class is \$5.00. There is no limit on the number of barrows each exhibitor may enter. A maximum of 4 barrows per exhibitor may be checked-in and exhibited at the show, regardless of the number entered.
4. **Arrival:** Jr. Market Barrow entries can begin arrival as early as Friday, September 9th, 2011 but must be on grounds by Saturday, September 10th, 2011. Move in hours are 8am until 5pm.
5. **Classification:** Market Barrows will be classified Saturday September 10th, 2011 at 6:00pm. Beginning at 6:00 PM barrows will be brought to the show ring and presented to the classifier in an order to be determined by Fair officials. Market Barrows will be classified, provide the declaration of weight, brand inspected and inspected by the Veterinarian. The decision of the classifier shall not be subject to protest or appeal.
6. **Show Weight:** Exhibitors will declare their own show weight rather than traditional weigh-in process. Weight will be declared by the exhibitor at time of classification and turned into the Jr. Barrow Superintendent. At judging, the judge will identify the top barrows. These barrows will then be weighed. Weights must correspond to the declared weight within 10 pounds plus or minus. Any not meeting the weight tolerances will be disqualified. Watering of pigs after pig is officially weighed and before the class is judged is prohibited and will be subject to disciplinary action. The barrows will then be placed. Declared weights for barrows must be in a range from 210 pounds to 270 pounds. Classes will be equally divided at Superintendent's discretion.

There will be eighteen (18) classes of barrows with two barrows selling from each class. The classes will consist of 2 Spots, 4 Durocs, 4 Hampshires, 2 Chester Whites/Landrace, 2 Yorkshires, and 4 Other Breeds and Crosses.

7. **Market Barrow Fitting:** Can be clipped prior to coming to the Fair but cannot be clipped on the fairgrounds. No dressing (such as oil, paint, powder, etc.) other than water may be used on barrows. Any barrow with dressing other than water will immediately be removed from the ring and will not be allowed to compete for premiums. Classifier will check for dressing, if found the animal and exhibitor will be disqualified. The classifier has the final say.
8. **Box Fans** will be allowed in the Swine Barns only with the approval of the

Superintendent. Fans will not be allowed in the aisles. All electrical cords must be Underwriters approved.

9. **Shavings will not be furnished by the New Mexico State Fair**, but may be purchased at the Feed Store located on the fairgrounds. There are no automatic waterers in the barns.
10. **Sale:** See Junior Livestock Sale Rules, Division 38.
  - A. Sale Barrows: decoration of market barrows is prohibited; barrows must be presented for sale in their natural state. (i.e. No glitter, oil, paint, balloons, etc. allowed.)
  - B. The Champions and Reserve Champions are eligible for the sale and 1st place from those classes.

11. **United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act**

The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the sale of market livestock sold during the New Mexico State Fair as follows:

- (a) Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug or chemical residues.
- (b) Antibiotics and sulfonamides have required withdrawal periods.
- (c) Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
- (d) If drug or other chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned.

A licensed veterinarian should be consulted, and drug label directions read, before administering any antibiotics or sulfonamides.

12. **Medications & Substances**

Any substances from syringes and needles must be administered by a vet ONLY! Anyone exhibitor that does not follow this may be disqualified and asked to leave the grounds.

13. **Market Certification Forms:**

All Exhibitors of Junior Market Animals are required to submit a Market Certification form and by signing such form, certify they are in compliance. The form must be signed by the following:

- (a) Junior exhibitor.
- (b) Parent or legal guardian.
- (c) County Extension Agent or Agricultural Education Advisor.

This form must be notarized and must be brought to the Show and given to the Show officials by the exhibitor at the time the market animals are classified and/or sifted. No Junior Market animal will be allowed to show without this Market Certification form properly filled out and notarized. NMSF requires only ONE Market Certification form PER EXHIBITOR regardless of the number of animals or species.

14. **Releases:** Superintendents will release animals after the show on Monday, September 12th, 2011. Once an exhibitor obtains a written release, they may leave the grounds at any time. Release forms for sale animals will be written September 16th, 2011 following the conclusion of the sale.
