Entry Fee

Entry fee of \$20.00 for each class (plus late fees if applicable) must accompany the entry. Parking permit, Office, and Exhibitor Pass fees must also accompany the entry.

Arrivals no earlier than noon, Sept. 15th, 2010 but must be on grounds by 5:00 pm Sept. 16th, 2010. Departure at conclusion of show.

Special Rules

Please Read Carefully

1. **American Angus Association Premium Assistance**

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri 64506, will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums participation in the show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself.

The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of 50 head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head.)

2. **Registration Requirements**

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal available for inspection at the show. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.

3. Female With Calf

Any female with calf at side, the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, must be registered by show date, have the original registration certificate at check-in and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.

4. Lead

Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.

5. Association Rules

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-811. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

6. Prohibited Acts

Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp, or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed, with the exception of false tail switches.

7. Coloring Agents

Effective July 1, 2004, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates the funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.

8. DNA / Blood Marker Tests

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

9. Rule Enforcement

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

NMLB GUIDE FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS
2010 SEASON

All out of state livestock must comply with New Mexico import requirements.

Cattle

•Proof of ownership (NMLB “Form 1” inspection certificate) must accompany the animal when traveling; this will assure that all requirements have been met.

•Brands:

1.All in state show cattle must be branded with a New Mexico registered brand; if not that of the brand’s registered owner, a bill of sale and a letter of permission from the brand’s owner is required.

2.Fresh brands are not allowed – the brand must be “peeled and healed”.

3.A freeze brand does not qualify as a New Mexico registered brand.

4.Cattle may be shown with the originating herd’s New Mexico registered brand with a bill of sale and a letter of permission from that brand owner.

5.Certificates of Brand Exemption are allowed only on registered breeding cattle under that ownership. Steers do not qualify for a Certificate of Brand Exemption.

•All breeding bulls require a negative trichomoniasis test.

•All cattle are required to have a negative T.B.

•Steers must have a negative T.B. test. 1 test is good for the calendar show season.

•All sexually intact cattle over 4 months of age must have a negative T.B. test no more than 120 days prior to exhibition (applies to in-state cattle only).

•ACCREDITED TB FREE HERD STATUS WILL BE RECOGNIZED.

1) No copies or faxed copies of TB test charts (VS Form 6-22) or health certificates will be accepted unless signed by the veterinarian (who administered the test) in blue ink certifying the copy.

The exhibitor must bring these documents to fair check-in.

2) NMLB approved regulatory identification is required for all test eligible animals, regardless of species or breed.

3) Any clinical signs or evidence of an infectious and/or contagious disease will result in that animal’s immediate removal from the fair grounds.

4) Out of state equine and livestock entries must adhere to New Mexico entry requirements and all current New Mexico fair entry requirements. Please call the NMLB office for state entry requirements.

ANY ANIMAL ARRIVING AT A SHOW OR FAIR, FOUND NOT TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH NEW MEXICO STATE STATUTES OR LIVESTOCK BOARD RULES WILL BE SENT HOME AND GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO BECOME COMPLIANT FOR FUTURE SHOWS AND FAIRS.

Additionally, be sure to contact the destination fairs and livestock shows for their own rules.
