# Entry Fee

Entry fees for each animal are \$20.00 (late fees if applicable) and must accompany the entry. Parking permit, Office, and Exhibitor Pass fees must also accompany the entry.

## Arrival / Departure

Begins at noon on Sept. 12th, 2011 but must be on grounds by Sept. 13th, 2011 at 5:00 pm. Departure at conclusion of show.

## Special rules

1. Red Angus Association of America, 4201 N I-35, Denton, TX 76207, (940) 387-3502. Registered Red Angus Cattle, including Category I-A (100%) and Category I-B (87%-99%) will be eligible to show.
2. This show will be conducted under a joint provision where Category I-A and Category I-B show together in the same classes.
3. Entries in classes at any Red Angus Show are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association of America with reference to general regulations, ownership requirements, the declaration of participation, performance information, right to appeal, protests, breeding show classifications, and show classifications.
4. This also will include inspection of entries, such as blood typing, mouthing and such other inspections prescribed by the Red Angus Association of America.

## NMLB GUIDE FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS 2011

### CATTLE

- Proof of ownership (NMLB “Form 1” inspection certificate) must accompany the animal when traveling, whether in or out of the district; this is the assurance that all requirements have been met.

- Brands:

- 1.All in state show cattle must be branded with a New Mexico registered brand; if the person showing the animal is not the brand’s registered owner, a bill of sale and a letter of permission from the brand’s owner is required.

- 2.Fresh brands are not allowed – the brand must be “peeled and healed”.

- 3.A freeze brand does not qualify as a New Mexico registered brand.

- 4.Cattle may be shown with the originating herd’s New Mexico registered brand with a bill of sale and a letter of permission from that brand owner.

- 5.Certificates of Brand Exemption are allowed only on registered breeding cattle under that ownership. Steers do not qualify for a Certificate of Brand Exemption.

- All breeding bulls require a negative trichomoniasis test. Exception - if health papers read “For exhibition only, not for sale or breeding” in lieu of test.

- All sexually intact dairy cattle over 4 months of age are required to have a negative TB test.

TB tests will be honored for 120 days prior to showing.

- Registered breeding show heifers must be identified by official breed registry number; either tattoo or tag for purposes of traceability. Grade heifers will require the NMLB approved fair tag.

- Accredited TB-Free Herd status will be recognized.

### ADDITIONAL RULES

- 1) No copies or faxed copies of TB test charts (VS Form 6-22) or health certificates will be accepted, unless signed by the veterinarian (who administered the test) in blue ink certifying the copy. The exhibitor must bring these documents to fair check-in.

- 2) NMLB approved regulatory identification is required for all test eligible animals.

- 3) Any clinical signs or evidence of an infectious and/or contagious disease will result in that animals immediate removal from the fair grounds.

- 4) Out of state equine and livestock entries must adhere to New Mexico entry requirements and all current New Mexico fair entry requirements. Please call the NMLB office for state entry requirements.

ANY ANIMAL, ARRIVING AT A SHOW OR FAIR, FOUND NOT TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH NEW MEXICO STATE STATUTES OR LIVESTOCK BOARD RULES WILL BE SENT HOME AND GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO BECOME COMPLIANT FOR FUTURE SHOWS AND FAIRS.

This information is provided only as a guide and may not contain all necessary requirements for livestock bound for exhibits and shows. It is extremely important to consult your 4-H Leader, FFA Advisor, County Agent and your Livestock Inspector for updated information well ahead of your planned date of transport. Be sure to contact the destination fairs and livestock shows for their own rules.

## Group Classes \$20.00 Entry

47. Senior Get-of-Sire. Four animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.
48. Junior Get-of-Sire. Three animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. Entries must have been calved on or after Sept. 1, 2010. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.
49. Produce-of-Dam. Two animals, either or both sexes, both shown in their respective classes. Animals shown in this class need not be owned by the exhibitor.
50. Premier Breeders Class. Will be computed from breeder's Open Red Angus 6

placement in individual classes only as follows: 3 points for each 1st; 2 points for each 2nd, 1 point for each 3rd. Maximum number of placements to be used to determine winner shall be limited to 5. Calculated on breeders of animals for exhibitors only. (In case of a tie, the next highest individual class placement will be used to determine the winner.)

51. Premier Exhibitors Class. Will be computed from exhibitor's placement in individual classes only as follows: 3 pts for each 1st; 2 pts for each 2nd; 1 pt for each 3rd. Maximum number of placements to be used to determine winner shall be limited to 5 (in case of tie, the next highest individual class placement will be used to determine the winner)

# Junior Red Angus

## Eligibility / Rules

1. Open to in-state and out-of-state youth.
2. Please see Open Red Angus Rules for Judging Information and Entry Fees listed at the beginning of this document.
3. Classes will be determined after all entries are assembled at the show location, and care will be exercised to ensure a minimum spread in age of animals within any individual class.
4. Animals entered must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor and must have been under the ownership of the junior member or a member of the immediate family of the junior member for a period of not less than 60 days prior to the date of the show.
5. All junior heifer entries will be eligible for competition in the open show. Entries in the junior heifer show must conform to the General Regulations pertaining to entries in open shows and are subject to all inspections applicable to open show entries.
